Monitoring Water Usage

At Home this Summer

With kids at home for summer break, many households use more water. Here are some tips to control your family's usage.

Make a habit to monitor the usage on your water meter. To do so, carefully remove your meter box cover, record the reading (black/white numbers represent full cubic metres). Repeat on a regular basis to track usage. To calculate usage, subtract the first reading from the second reading. E.g. Day I is 5.71 and Day 2 is 6.91, the usage in that period was 1.2 cubic metres.

Teach your family water-saving tips to avoid unnecessary high bills.:

- Ensure faucets are closed off tightly.
- Turn off water while brushing your teeth.
- Wash hands quickly.
- No unnecessary toilet flushing.

During the summertime, temperatures also means faster water evaporation so:

- Avoid overfilling your pool.
- Water your lawn before 10am.
